The Auto Care Caucus exists to promote the legislative and regulatory interests of the automotive repair industry. In the 116th Congress, the Auto Care Caucus was comprised of 51 legislators from both the Democratic and Republican parties. The mission of the Auto Care Caucus is to maintain a competitive free market for the motoring public; protect consumers' vehicle data and their right to be the ultimate owners and stewards of their data; and to help ensure consumers have access to quality, convenient and affordable auto repairs, maintenance and parts. The Auto Care Caucus is a bipartisan organization made up of lawmakers from across the United States. Members include elected officials in the House of Representatives who have an interest in protecting the safety and economic well-being of American consumers and the livelihood of the auto care industry.
